- An all call will be sent to all principals, EL coordinators and elected DELAC members before each meeting
- There is a need to revise Eureka City Schools (ECS) master plan for EL.
 - The DELAC committee will be advising the district in developing the master plan

- The LCAP will consult with the DELAC committee prior to going to the School Board for approval
